Code of Conduct

By participating in Unleashed/GovHack 2014, as a competitor, you agree to the following. I will:

Treat others with respect

I will not abuse, stalk, harass or threaten others. I will not make offensive comments related to gender, sexual orientation, disability, physical appearance, body size, race, or religion. I will not disrupt other people or the event. I will not make inappropriate physical contact or pay unwelcome sexual attention to other participants.

Keep it G-rated and be mindful of my language

I will not swear or make sexist, racist, or other exclusionary jokes which may be offensive to those around me. I will behave in a way that is suitable for anyone to view, including young children. I will only submit competition material that is suitable for anyone to view, including young children.

Respect the venue and equipment

I will keep the venue clean and tidy and use the rubbish and recycling bins as appropriate. I will let the organisers know if there are any issues.

Follow the competition rules

I will only use authorised materials that I have the right to use and release. I will not submit any projects which are potentially libellous, false, defamatory or overtly political, or which contain material which is potentially confidential, commercially sensitive, or which would cause personal distress or loss. I will check the website and/or speak with one of the organisers if at any stage I am unclear on the competition rules. I will not submit an entry that I have started prior to the competition launch at 5.30pm.

Look after myself and others

I will remember that we are all here to create, not party. If I am under 18, I will ensure my guardian is with me whenever I am at the venue.

If I am the guardian of a participant under 18, I will ensure I keep an eye on them. If I am feeling uncomfortable, am being harassed, notice that someone else is being harassed, or have any other concerns; I will immediately contact an Unleashed/GovHack organiser.

Respect the decisions of Unleashed/GovHack Organisers

Remember that the Unleashed/GovHack organisers are in charge and have put a lot of effort in to organising a great event. I will not do anything to ruin the event or engage in any behaviour that violates this code of conduct. I understand that the Unleashed/GovHack organisers may take any action they deem appropriate, including warnings or expulsion from the Unleashed/GovHack event.

I understand that if I am removed from the event due to inappropriate behaviour, I will no longer be eligible to compete for Unleashed/GovHack prizes.

Volunteers and Mentors

Many people are volunteering their time so that you can get on with creating your entry.

Volunteers are here to help with any general issues you might have with regard to the venue, toilets, moving equipment, catering, access to and from the building, emergencies and competition rules or issues.

Unleashed Crew

If you need help, look for a person in a green unleashed t-shirt with “CREW” written on the back, or wearing a GovHack T-Shirt. They will be wearing a green pass.



Data and Technical Mentors

The Unleashed Crew can assist you with making contact with Data Mentors as well as assist you with technical help.

Data

You will find the list of national data available for the national GovHack competition at

Check the eligibility requirements of the GovHack National Major Prizes to see if you need to use a specific dataset for the prize category you want to enter.

You will find all of South Australian data on the data.sa website at <http://data.sa.gov.au>

To be eligible for South Australian Prizes you must use at least one data set available on data.sa. Some prize categories may have additional data requirements.

To maximise your chances to win prizes you may want to mash up National and South Australian data, giving you a chance in as many categories as possible.

Additional Metadata

Some data sets listed on data.sa may have additional resources available with further information on how to use the data or other supporting material. You are encouraged to download and use these resources. If

you have questions about a dataset let a crew member know and we will try to find a data mentor for you.

If you have any technical difficulties with data.sa.gov.au, contact a crew member on location for assistance. If you are not on location please email datasa@sa.gov.au for support.

Prizes

Teams are eligible for some great prizes, in addition to honour, fame and an Unleashed or GovHack Trophy:

- National People's Choice Award
- National GovHack Prizes, including flights for a limited number of finalists from each location to Brisbane for the Red Carpet Awards.
- Spirit of GovHack Prizes



Individuals may also be nominated for participation prizes at each node of Unleashed including:

- Spirit of Unleashed
- Youth Unleashed Prizes.

Any prize money will be issued via EFT to the nominated Team Captain after the Awards night. In the Spirit of Unleashed prize money should be split equally amongst all registered team members on your team page.

Mentor and entrepreneur prizes will be based on agreement between the parties of the relationship within scope of the award.

Submission of Entry

An entry can be anything that uses open data in a clever and creative way. It might be an application, an analysis, data visualisation, a 3D printed or laser cut representation of data, a digitised project or anything that fits the spirit of GovHack and Unleashed. National GovHack competition entries must use Government Data in some form. The scope for Unleashed is wider; any open data released on data.sa including industry and University data can be used. An entry must meet the eligibility criteria for the specific prize category nominated by your team. This may include the use of specific datasets.

Teams are required to submit the following as part of their competition entry:

A descriptive project page. The page must list your team members, details about your project, what data sets you used and what competition categories (local and national) you are going for. This must be submitted by the advised deadline. (Stay tuned on Saturday of the competition weekend for details.)

Outcomes from the project itself. Any code, graphics, mashups, applications, website URLs must be made available under an open source/content licence to be eligible for prizes. If judges are able to see and play with it that is useful, but this is a minor component of the judging. You can put the code/source on GitHub, Sourceforge or an equivalent repository system and must make the URL available on your team page for verification.

A three minute pre-recorded video. This should be embedded on your project page. It could include the team talking about your project, a screencast of the project, or anything else appropriate for video. Check out the Developer Kit (<http://www.govhack.org/howto/>) for some assistance and instruction on how to make a compelling video.

Entries are required to be submitted 5pm (ACST) Sunday 13 July (South Australia Time). If you have loading issues please contact a crew member who will provide a USB alternative to ensure you meet the 5pm deadline.

Judging

All Unleashed and GovHack entries will be judged by the Judging Panels against the following criteria:

- originality
- relevance to the team nominated category definition
- consistency with contest purposes including social value
- quality and design (including standards compliance)
- usability (including documentation and ease of use).

Participant Information

Venue Opening times

The competition runs for about 48 hours and many people will try to burn the midnight oil to get their entry done. The Mount Gambier Library will be open for competitors Friday until 9.30pm, Saturday 7.30am until 9.30pm and Sunday 7.30am until 6.00pm.

If you are concerned with leaving the venue late at night please discuss with a crew member on location.

Things to Bring

Please label all your stuff so we can return it to you if you leave it behind.

Please note that it is your responsibility to look after your own items, and we accept no liability for any damages or losses you may incur.

Here is a list of things you will probably want to have with you at the venue.

- laptop/Development platform
- phone and device chargers
- coffee mug / water bottle
- proof of age
- parent/guardian if you are under 18 (you may be asked for proof-of-age at the event).

Unfortunately, we cannot store bikes on site, however there is a bike cordons close by.

Your Participant Pass

This is what a participant pass looks like:



You will be issued your pass on Friday night at the registration desk. You will also receive a goody bag and T-Shirt.

Please wear your pass at all times whilst at the competition venue. Besides showing us that you are a valid competitor, we will not allow you into the building **outside normal library operating hours** if you do not have your participants pass.

We also want to ensure that only valid participants are working in the teams, so if we can't see your pass, we may ask you to produce ID to prove your identity and validity for working with that team. If you cannot produce a valid ID, and/or you are not listed as a member of that team, then you will be asked to leave, and the team may be disqualified from the competition.

There is a space at the top of the pass for you to write your name (Twitter handle, etc.), and a space at the bottom for you to write your team's name. Please fill these in so that it's easier for others to call you by name, and so we know which team you're from.

On the back of the pass you will find the phone number for Management in case you need emergency help or need to get in or out of the building and can't find a volunteer.

Coffee

You will be allocated with 9 tea/coffee vouchers redeemable from the Bookmark Cafe. Replacement vouchers will not be issued so please look after them.

Instant tea and coffee will be available throughout the competition from the Multifunction Room.

Food

Meals will be supplied:

- supper on Friday night
- breakfast, lunch and dinner on Saturday
- breakfast and lunch on Sunday.

Various snacks and drinks will also be available.

Event Road Map

You have only approximately 48 hours to get your entry completed, so here is a guide to how you might want to allocate your time. This is only a guide, and you can do whatever you want to get your entry done.

Friday:

- Make a team and register it
- Map out your entry idea
- Identify possible users and customers
- Identify data sets, Unleashed and/or GovHack prize categories you are targeting
- Start filling out your Team Site
- Start creating

Saturday:

- Continue or start creating
- Talk to the mentors
- Submit team registration pack and nominate prize categories
- Test and refine the entry
- Keep building

Sunday:

- Finalise building your entry
- Film your 3 minute presentation video and upload to your team site
- Get your team site completed to meet all entry criteria
- Finish and submit entry by 5.00pm
- Complete the Prize EFT form and submit to Unleashed Crew and then keep your fingers crossed that you win.

Don't forget to look after yourself: take breaks, eat, drink and go for an occasional walk. Allow some time to get away and freshen up. Showers clear the mind!

Venue

Parking

Please be mindful that the Helen Street car park is in a 3 hour time zone so please remember to move any vehicles to prevent parking fines.

Smoking

The venue is designated non-smoking. Smoking is permitted outside where there are suitable disposal for cigarette butts. You will need to see a crew member to gain access outside and inside the building.

Security and Access to the Building

There is a green exit button which you press to exit the building. Should you need to regain entry and you have not already made arrangements with a crew member, please telephone management as per the back of your participant pass

Emergency Exit Locations

In the event of an emergency please follow the crew's instructions who will assist your safe exit from the building. Our first emergency exit is located through the front Library doors, with exits available to the left of the Cafe and back entrance. Staff will evacuate the building to the Cave Gardens area accordingly. Please move quickly and in an orderly manner.

Participant Passes

If you are not wearing your participant pass you will not be allowed back into the venue outside normal Library operating hours. If you lose your pass, please find a volunteer or if locked out of the building, please telephone management as per the back of your participant pass.

Work Health and Safety

Work Health and Safety refers to policies, procedures, legislations and activities which aim to protect the health and safety of people within a workplace. Specific ways to limit hazards to yourself or another person whilst participating are listed below.

- If you have any existing injuries, inform a volunteer.
- If you notice any hazards, report them immediately to a volunteer or Unleashed Crew(eg water spillages).
- Minimise the risk of tripping by getting a volunteer to place gaffer tape over cords, securing them to the floor.
- Place tables and electrical items close to the power outlets whenever possible.
- Bend your knees when you lift.

Manual handling occurs when you are lifting, lowering, pushing, pulling, carrying, moving, holding, restraining any person or thing. It's unlikely you'll have to lift anything heavy at this event - do you really need to be moving that? Check with a volunteer before moving anything larger than a laptop.

Before lifting:

- Stop and assess the load and seek help if it's too heavy.
- Consult a volunteer or Unleashed Crew for advice on how to manage heavy loads.
- Plan the lift, i.e., estimate the load and know where it is to be placed prior to lifting.
- Can you reduce the load? Does the lift require two people?
- Avoid placing heavy object on the ground if they have to be picked up later.
- Ensure objects to be lifted have sufficient space around to enable safe lifting.

First Aid

If the person is unconscious or requires an ambulance, immediately dial 000 and get a crew member.
